

The First Indian Superintendent of Alipore Zoo, Sri Ram Brahma Sanyal did much to improve the standing of the zoo. He achieved good success in captive breeding in an era when such initiatives were rarely heard of. One such success was a live birth of the rare Sumatran Rhinoceros in 1889. The first Indian One-horned Rhinoceros came in Alipore Zoo on 7th April, 1877. It was donated by the Maharaja of Dumraon. Later on, in 1886 and 1877, 2 more Indian One-horned Rhinos were donated to the zoo. Another species, the Malayan One-horned Rhinoceros also came in Alipore Zoological Garden 1877. A juvenile of the species was bought on 17th November, 1877. Another juvenile of the same species was donated by Mouli Tazmul Ally, Khan Bahadur on 11th October, 1880. In 1887, another Malayan One-horned Rhinoceros was purchased. A female Hairy-eared Rhinoceros was donated to the zoo by Anwar Ally Khan, son of Begum Latifa Khatun of Chittagong on 2nd June, 1882. A juvenile of this species was presented by Sir Charles Bernard. K.C.S.I. on 24th April, 1884.

One male and one female Sumatran Rhinoceros were purchased on 3rd July, 1883. On 30th January, 1889 a hybrid were born from the R. lasiotis (Hairy-eared Rhinoceros) and R. sumatrensis (Sumatran Rhinoceros). This is one of the few examples of success in captive breeding of Sumatran Rhinoceros in nineteenth century.


