Sir Jotindra Mohan Tagore Library


Sir Jotindra Mohan Tagore Library in Zoological Garden, Alipore is named after the late Maharaja Sir Jotindra Mohan Tagore, K.C.I.E., of Calcutta, who was a constant supporter of the Zoological Garden, and was a recognised leader of Bengal Aristocracy. From a very early age, he showed exceptional literary taste for both Bengali and English composition. He also showed great interest in theatres, music and painting. In 1871, he received the title of 'Raja Bahadur'. Sir Jotindra Mohan Tagore was a patron to the Zoological Garden, Alipore and he was very much interested to build a library in the Zoo. He wished that all animal-medicine related books of the world should be kept in this library. For this, he donated a huge amount of money to Zoological Garden, Alipore. With this money, a huge library was built in the zoo premises in 1898. Another patron of the Zoo, Sir Jhon Edgar, donated some bookshelves for the library. This heritage library currently contains around 1400 books, of which many are rare books.

Vanmahotsab, 14.07.2018:

Vanmahotsab is the festival of planting Trees. The festival was observed at the Zoological Garden, Alipore on 14th July, 2018. Hon'ble Chief Minister Smt. Mamata Banerjee penned the slogan for this year's Vanmahotsab which is "Aranya o Banyapran, Prakriti Mayer Sabuj Daan" which goes quite too well with the activities of the zoo as both 'Aranya' i.e. forest and 'Banyapran' i.e. wildlife are conserved in the zoo.

On the morning of the event, the staff of Zoological Garden, Alipore assembled at the zoo compound and initiated the programme. The first tree was planted at the Glass Enclosure for Tiger by Sri Asis Kumar Samanta, IFS, Director, Zoological Garden, Alipore. He was joined by Dr. Piyali Chattopadhyay, Deputy Director, Zoological Garden, Alipore and other staff of the ZGA.

It was heavily raining on the day, but the staff were very much enthusiastic about the programme. The sapling planting went on for the entire day till it was impossible to work for the rain. About 500 saplings of different species were planted in the zoo at many places. The Day was celebrated to make people more aware of the value of the trees and with hope that the saplings planted today will grow into big trees and help the environment.



1. A chronic wound on the right hind leg of the lion was observed by the keepers and reported to the Veterinary Officers. Proper care was taken immediately. The wound was treated with antibiotic course and antiinflammatory/pain killer injection. The wound dressing was done on one day interval with antiseptic solution. After few days of treatment, the Lion recovered and transferred to the enclosure.


2. A female zebra was found to be wounded at the thigh region and different other parts of the body due to infighting with another zebra. Regular dressing of the wound was done with mercurochrome solution and antiseptic lotion. Injection of antibiotic course and anti-inflammatory/pain killer drug was given through blow pipe.

3. One of the female yellow monitors had a tumorous growth on the right foreleg. The veterinary Officers of Zoological Garden, Alipore Dr. Arnab Majie and Dr. Pankaj Kumar successfully operated and removed the tumour. After that regular dressing of the foreleg was done and the yellow monitor was treated with antibiotic course, pain killers and Vitamin B-Complex injection.



4. The normal coloured tigress Rani was found to be wounded and partial anorexia was observed. It was reported to the Veterinary Officers by the keepers and immediate action was taken. Anti-septic cream and lotion was applied on the lesion on regular interval. Anti-biotic course and Vitamin B-complex was also given via injection. After proper care for a few days, the tigress recovered from the wound and transferred to the enclosure.

ANIMAL HOUSES:





The Murshidabad House:

The Murshidabad House is named in honour of its donor, H.H. the Nawab Bahadur of Murshidabad. At that time "The Birds of Paradise" was there. Several valuable birds are found here.





The Schwendler House:

This house was made after Carl Louis Schwendler (Postmaster to the Govt. of India) in the year 1876. On 10th February, 1876 Carl Louis Schwendler donated Siamese Fireback, Monaul, Linn, Wild Common: Fowl, Sikkim Horned Pheasant, Guinea Fowl, and Peacock Pheasant.

The Swarnamoyee House

This house has been erected at the cost of Maharaja Manindra Chandra Nandy, the nephew and successor of the late Maharani Swarnamoyee of Cossimbajar. The house was extended in three sides of the main building there are three lofty wirenetting aviaries (the Eastern Aviary, The Western Aviary and The Central aviary) which contains bushes and trees and afford practically a natural home for the birds.
